Introduction

You can now store your diploma on your phone! The Digital Credential Wallet, promoted by the Ministry of Digital Affairs, is a digital solution that allows important documents - such as your academic diploma - to be converted into secure digital credential cards and stored directly on your mobile device. Whenever needed, you can quickly present and verify your credentials without carrying physical documents.

With the use of digital signatures and encryption technologies, these credentials are tamper-proof and verifiable. At the same time, you remain in control of your personal data and can choose what information to share, ensuring both convenience and privacy protection.

Application Procedure

Once you have received your digital PDF diploma, you can apply for your Digital Credential Card. Simply visit the Digital Credential Management Center website (<https://dcmc.csie.ncku.edu.tw>), upload your diploma, and enter the unique verification code sent to your email. After confirming your information, submit the application and the system will generate a dedicated QR code. By downloading the Digital Credential Wallet app and scanning the QR code, your diploma can be added to your phone.

When you need to use it - such as for academic or job applications - simply scan the QR code provided by the verifier using the app. Your credential card will be displayed automatically, and you can choose which information to share. After confirming, the verification process is completed. The entire process is fast, convenient, and secure.



Q&A

The Digital Credential Wallet is a government-provided service that is free to use (some third-party features may incur additional charges), so there is no need to worry about extra costs. In terms of security, the system adopts multiple protection mechanisms, including encryption and identity verification, to ensure that your credential data is safe and reliable.

You also have full control over what information you choose to share, helping reduce the risk of personal data exposure. If your phone is lost, your credentials can be protected through suspension and locking mechanisms to prevent unauthorized use.
